

Medical Leadership Program

Scholarship information for applicants

The UQ School of Business and the Faculty of Medicine are offering a limited number of full and partial tuition scholarships to students commencing the Medical Leadership Program (MLP) in 2019.

Applications open: 6 December 2018

Applications close: 31 January 2019

To be eligible for these scholarships you must:

- a) Be a current full time UQ MD/MBBS student; or
- b) UQ MD/MBBS alumni (training at junior doctor level); and
- c) Meet the requirements for entry into the MLP; and
- d) Submit an application to the Medical Dean by the closing date

Value of the scholarship:

Scholarships will cover either 50% or 100% of tuition fees for the MLP.

Selection process:

For the selection process, the Faculty of Medicine will establish a selection committee, comprising:

- a) The Medical Dean, or nominee, as the chair of the committee
- b) At least two other Faculty of Medicine staff members

The selection committee may decide to interview short-listed applicants.

Selection criteria:

The scholarships will be awarded to the applicants showing the greatest merit, as demonstrated by:

- a) Evidence of financial need
- b) Service to students in the MD/MBBS program
- c) Academic merit
- d) Leadership potential
- e) Rural background
- f) Any other matter that the selection committee considers to be relevant to the applicant's future success in the profession of medicine

Please submit a personal statement (maximum two pages) outlining why you should be selected for the scholarship, addressing the relevant selection criteria.

Terms and conditions of award:

- a) Applications received after 31 January 2019 will not be considered
- b) Applicants will be notified via email of the outcome of the scholarship selection process
- c) Scholarships are limited and awarded on a competitive basis
- d) Scholarship winners must commence the MLP by Semester 2 2019
- e) The MLP scholarship will be valid for 24 months. Extensions will be considered only in exceptional circumstances and on a case-by-case basis
- f) Continuation of scholarship funding is contingent on the scholarship recipient maintaining a GPA of 5.0 or higher in their MD/MBBS program

Termination of scholarship

The University will terminate a scholarship:

- a) If the recipient does not comply with the scholarship conditions; or
- b) Once maximum duration of the scholarship has lapsed; or
- c) If the recipient defers, interrupts or suspends their study; or
- d) If the student commits serious misconduct.
